


KS2 Homework Menu

<p>Write a description of an imaginary setting either in space, an alien planet or maybe even a space hotel! Remember to use all your senses to describe what you can see, smell, hear, touch and taste.</p> <p>L.O. To write a description of an imaginary land</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a range of wow words • Use a dictionary and a thesaurus • Use a range of adjectives and sentence openers. 	<p>Place the numbers from 1 to 9 in the squares below so that the <u>difference</u> between joined squares is odd. How many different ways can you do this?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>LO: To understand what 'difference' means. To work systematically to solve a problem</p>	<p>Help Our Habitats!</p> <p>Research the phrase 'Climate Change'. What does it mean? Who or what will it affect? Ask a grown-up at home, read some information books, search on the Internet to find out. You could present all you have learned and understood in a Slides presentation, a speech, booklet, news report...choose the best way you feel you can get this information across to your audience.</p> <p>L.O. To apply your scientific understanding to a research project.</p>	<p>Make a change that helps to save the environment. Write about what you have done and tell us how that will help to save the planet.</p> <p>Here are some ideas.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • cook something using ingredients with as little packaging as possible • put a bird feeder or bug hotel in the garden • turn the tap off when brushing their teeth to reduce water use • put food waste in a compost bin and use the compost in the garden • spend more time doing leisure activities which don't use electricity such as reading a book 	<p>Draw or paint a picture of the solar system, making sure you include all the planets in the correct order and try to show which planets are the biggest and smallest.</p> <p>LO: I can make a picture of the solar system</p>

<p>Find a description of a setting in a book you enjoy. Copy out the description and write a paragraph telling me why you like it. Are there any particular words you like? Has the author used similes, metaphors or alliteration?</p> <p>L.O. To think about what you are reading and why you like it.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<p>1. Dan the detective looked for a number. He found a two-digit number less than 50. The sum of its digits was 12. Their difference was 4. What number did Dan find?</p>  <p>2. Dan found a two-digit odd number. One of its digits was half the other. The number was greater than 50. What number did Dan find?</p> <p>Can you make up your own number problems to solve like Detective Dan. Try them out on your family!</p> <p>LO: To solve a given problem by organising and interpreting data in a simple table. Write whole numbers in figures; know what each digit represents</p>	<p><u>Design a seed packet!</u></p> <p>In our topic this half term, we'll be designing a plant that has features to help it survive ALL kinds of environmental changes.</p> <p>This homework task is focusing on designing the seed packet which describes the plant's features: specific sowing instructions, illustrations of the plant, instructions on when and where it should be sown and most importantly, make it appealing so people want to buy and grow it!</p> <p>L.O. To demonstrate an understanding of scientific vocabulary</p>	<p>Make a leaflet/presentation/poster about a country that is more environmentally-aware than the UK; can we learn from them?</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Make a poster to explain why recycling is important</p>	<p>Find a famous picture of the sea, for example Seascapes by the artist J. M. W. Turner. Make a copy of one you like, using your chosen method (paints, crayons etc) and then tell me what you like about it.</p> <p>LO: I can say what I like and dislike about a famous painting</p>
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
