A-Z Art Glossary

Abstract Art - pictures that are not representationally accurate. Abstract artists exaggerate or simplify the forms in the world around them

Acrylic Paint - is an artificially made paint that dries very quickly

Art Criticism - when you give your opinion or judgment about the good or bad qualities of a work of art

Blend - To merge colours on a piece of paper or canvas. A type of shading

Charcoal - compressed burnt wood used for drawing

Colour- is produced when light, striking an object, is reflected back to the eye

Colour Wheel - shows what happens when colours are mixed and explores relationships between colours

Complementary Colours - are two colours on opposite sides of the colour wheel. They intensify each other when next to each other and make brown shades when they are mixed together

 ${\it Composition}$ - the way that people or things are arranged in a painting or photograph

Crosshatching - is a technique that creates tonal or shading affects when straight lines are placed at an angle against the first line

Cubism - an art movement (1907 - 1914) begun by Pablo Picasso and Georges Braque

Diagonal - Having a slanted direction

Illusion- a deceptive or misleading image

Image - A picture, idea, or impression of a person, thing, or idea

Impasto - a thick or lumpy application of paint

Line - a mark with length and direction

Model - a person who poses for an artist

Painting - works of art made with paint on a surface

Pointalism- a method of painting developed in France in the 1880's in which tiny dots of colour are applied to the canvas. When viewed from a distance the colours appear to blend together

Photo Realism – a style of art from the 1970's that depicted everyday scenes with detailed realism, the brushwork is barely visable

Portrait - a work of art that depicts a person, group of people, or an animal

Proportion - refers to the relationship of one part or whole to another in terms of size, quantity, degree or ratio

Shape – an enclosed space. Examples of shapes include circle, oval, oblong, pentagon

Tactile - relates to the sense of touch

Technique - methods of working with art materials to produce an art object

Texture - is the surface quality or feel of an object

Three -dimensional - having or appearing to have, height, width, and depth

Tool -any instrument or equipment used to produce or learn about art

Tonal Scale - a scale starting with white or the lightest tint and gradually changing to the darkest shade or black

Tone - refers to the lightness and darkness of a colour

Vertical - the direction going straight up and down
