	CS gave a verbal update:	JH	
	 193 children on roll. Not same children as in previous total because some have left, some have joined. 24 children in the Nursery. 		
	• Y3 is full but due to an error by Local Authority (Admissions Authority) a place has been offered so the school has agreed to the over-admittance. There is physical space in the classroom.		
	Q A governor asked whether this would affect other children in Y3 where there are already a number of SEND pupils. Ans: The number of SEND pupils in Y3 is similar to the number in other class groups.		
	All staff are back in school. Over half are not yet vaccinated.		
	• AL Trust Consultant, Richard Lloyd, has increased capacity and is working in school with SLT.

 Educational Visits programme has started for all classes. Y6' residential trip is not allowed but Y6 has had an extended activity day at Grafham Water. Many After School Clubs have resumed. Running track will open soon. 	
Data: NFER and teacher assessments: Outcome data from assessments for Maths and English is on Gov Zone. Reports of monitoring visits for LGB Priority 2 on Gov Zone and discussed in Item 6 below. Q In response to a question, headteacher said that she was not disappointed with the outcomes where maths is less good than reading. Overall data compares favourably with other schools in the Primary Hub. AL Trust assessment lead will pool the data from all schools to give a visual analysis. ACTION: CS will share this with SM and GC when it is available.	CS to share comparison analysis of data
 Q How is school addressing areas where assessment results are less good? Ans: In maths, KS is working with teachers to look at whole class and individual children's issues. In English, there is a whole school project and RG is talking to individual teachers to determine whether separate and further interventions are needed. It was noted and acknowledged that statistical variations in Stapleford's data seem large because it is a small one class entry school. 	
SENDCo reported that COVID had had an obvious impact. 65% of SEND pupils had made progress but the 35% who had not progressed were not in school during lockdown.	JH look into
Q A governor commented that the data as presented does not show the value added element of how school is helping to accelerate progress. Ans: Now that NFER tests are being used across Stapleford and Primary Hub schools, the NFER tool will be used to track the data so that it may be compared and analysed to previous years and between schools. A governor asked whether it will be possible to build up longitudinal data to track the pathway of progression for an anonymised individual or group. ACTION: JH will look into this facility.	Insight tracking of individuals/ groups as they progress through school.
Clerk reminded governors that they would have a further opportunity to ask questions on the data at the next LGB. The data had only become available within 24 hours of this LGB meeting.

KJ explained the challenge in which budgets for SEND pupils are allocated in September, but needs may arise/ be identified during the year and have to be met with no extra funds. Rise in SEND needs (from 25 to 39 pupils). Impact of Covid noticeable particularly in Rec and Y1. 12 families now needing some support as a result of Covid. Previously no families were in need. Interventions are more difficult because of bubbles. KJ hopes to meet in person with AW to see the documentation and will report at 17 June LGB. 	AW / KJ

Ans: The Trust has restructured to facilitate the expansion. Two headteachers have been given a day each per week to work on school improvement and provide additional capacity in AL schools. Also two assistant Directors have been appointed. One Director is to work with schools to support effective provision for the disadvantaged, vulnerable and SEND groups and to ensure appropriate safeguarding measures to help all pupils. The second Director has two days per week to lead on Professional Learning, Early Years, succession and development of staff in all the AL schools. Also to liase with Teacher Training Hub. Q A governor asked about the AL's commitment to looking into specialist teaching in primary schools. Ans: There is a working group to look into how primaries can best fulfil specialist curriculum areas like music, PE etc.
