Our Learning

Topics

Our topics in Reception are guided by the children's interests, although we do cover certain specific themes across the year, such as seasons, festivals and celebrations. Our learning theme for this term is "Come On, Let's Celebrate" focusing on celebrations and festivals of light, including Christmas. If your family celebrate a particular festival or tradition and you would like to share this with the class, we would love to welcome you into school to do this.

This term we will also be focusing on the scientific concept of light and dark. Attached you will find the topic web which provides an overview of this half term's learning. We send out a new overview each half term.

Phonics

The children have been making fantastic progress learning the phonemes that have been introduced to them last half term. In our daily phonics sessions we will continue to introduce phase 2 and 3 sounds and teach how to use these in our reading and writing. A reading and phonics information evening is being held virtually at 6pm on Tuesday 9th November. I hope many of you will be able to attend. The link for joining is meet.google.com/ory-xnme-nfg

Home reading books

We will continue to provide two types of books for the children to take home. These are:

- **a reading practise book** matched to your child's phonic stage that they can read independently. They should be able to read at least 95% of the words in these books. It may not be a different book every time; it may need to be the same book if your child still needs to develop fluency. They will have already read this book three times in school before bringing it home. These books need to be returned to school each Monday.
 - **a sharing book** that they can talk about and enjoy with their parent/carer. These books will be your child's choice and are to help develop a love of reading! These books need to be returned to school each Friday.
- The children also have access to active learn bug club for additional ebooks which are matched to their phonic knowledge.

P.E.

Mrs Cameron will be teaching the class P.E. lessons on Friday afternoons. Please ensure your child comes to school in their P.E. kit each Friday.

Homework

In Reception the children are not given formal homework, however parental support in this early stage has a huge impact on how they learn in school. The weekly update is where I will share with you the learning and activities we've been doing in class and some suggestions for practical activities to do at home to enhance their school learning. This will be added onto the memo section of Tapestry. I would love to see any work the children do at home.

Now the children are more settled, I will send home information about 'Mathletics' which is an online website we use for maths homework.

We will endeavour to visit the moat each Friday morning. We have enough waterproof trousers for every child and most of the children now have wellies kept in school.
