P.E. / Marvellous Moat Sessions

Home Learning

Literacy:

Each week children will continue to bring home a practise reading book (at the phonics level that is appropriate for each child), and a sharing book which the children choose for themselves. There are also additional ereaders available on Phonics Bug Club. Daily reading for at least ten minutes is recommended.

Maths:

The children have access to online learning program 'Mathletics' to practise their maths skills.

To increase their mathematical fluency it would be good to practise counting, ordering and recognising numbers up to 20 (or larger numbers if they can do this already!) and find all the different ways to make numbers up to 10, e.g. 0+4, 1+3, 2+2, 3+1, 4+0 all make 4. Other Areas of Learning:
