This half term we will continue to travel back in time to learn about The Romans! We will explore how Vesuvius erupted and destroyed a city and we will get creative by designing and making our very own Roman chariots. Our Roman day will be on Friday 4th March so feel free to come in dressed as a Roman for the whole day and be prepared to take part in lots of arty activities.

In English, we will read and discuss a twist on a fairytale by looking at The Three Little Pigs from the wolf's point of view.
