As Artists we will be exploring 3D modelling through our use of clay. We will investigate the Benin bronzes and the artwork of Ancient Benin to inspire our own pieces. We will also investigate traditional patterns from different countries in Africa and will use this as an inspiration for printing bags.

As Designers we will be making a selection of dishes from West Africa. During this time, we will also explore where different fruit and vegetables originate, how this has changed over time and debate the environmental impact of this.

Linking to our English work on Fair Trade, we will also design and make chocolate truffles. As Historians we will identify key events and periods within the chronology of Africa as a continent. Through this we will consider the impact each of these events has had. Afterwards we will find out about Nelson Mandela and apartheid in South Africa.

We will then focus on Ancient Benin. This will involve investigation into why the kingdom emerged, how it developed, what life was like and how it came to end.

To develop our Personal, Social and Emotional Development we will be finding out about how to manage risk.

As Geographers we will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe the human and physical geographical features of Africa.

As Computer technologists we will find out about web page creation and will create our own on google sites.

As Explorers of Religion we will learn about how different religions interpret the story of life and death.

We will be physical through our development of gymnastics. Mrs Pugh has been hugely impressed with Year 6's work on this already and will continue to build on these skills. They will also be working on games which will include outdoor adventure games, bochia and goal ball.
