



## Year 4 Homework Menu

<p>Create an acrostic poem linked to our topic. <b>L.O. To become familiar with a range of types of poem.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go and choose a word to go down the side of your page.</li> <li>• Remember in the poem, each line will start with the next letter of that word, just like I'm doing here!</li> <li>• Every good acrostics should include examples of figurative language such as personification or simile, as well as exciting vocabulary.</li> <li>• Even more impressive, you could make your poem rhyme or have a rhythmic pattern.</li> <li>• Kindly remember that you don't have to use full sentences in a poem.</li> <li>• Specific topic vocabulary can be used to make your poem more relevant.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Fractions</b></p> <p>In how many different ways can you <u>halve</u> an A4 sheet of paper? You might start off with something like these two, eg:</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Have a good explore and see what different ways you can find. Don't be afraid to be creative! How will you know if they are halves?</p> <p>Ext - try to do it with other fractions, what is the smallest fraction you can make? <b>LO: recognise and show using diagrams, families of equivalent fractions for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> and <math>\frac{1}{2}</math></b></p>	<p>Think about how, in your local environment, you could help protect habitats and the animals that live in them. Create an information poster showing some of these ways. <b>L.O. To demonstrate an understanding of potential threats to the environment.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe some different threats to your local environment.</li> <li>• Explain how to help stop these threats.</li> <li>• Explain how to help animals deal with these threats.</li> <li>• Engage your reader's attention by using images, colour and exciting words.</li> </ul>	<p>LO: To create a collage with a Greek theme</p> <p>Using any media of your choice, create a collage of a Greek god. You can use all kinds of things that you find around your house such as bits of material, buttons and coloured paper.</p>	<p><b>Humanities Ancient Greeks</b></p> <p><b>LO to find out about the first olympic games</b></p> <p>Find out about the first Olympic games. Where was it held and who took part? What sort of events did it include?</p> <p>Compare it with the modern olympics. How is it different? What is still the same?</p>

Write a character description of your chosen God, making sure you include physical features and information about their character.</p>	<p><b>Sorting Fish</b></p> <p>There are 12 fish in a tank. How many different ways could they be blue and red?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<p>Design a poster or a PP or slides presentation to showcase all you know about living things and their habitats. <b>L.O. to know what 7 criteria all living things must have (life processes)</b></p>	<p>As Summer begins, collect a range of different natural objects and create a piece of art outside. Don't forget to take a photo of what you have created. <b>L.O. <p>Extension - Make up your own Greek god or goddess. What would it be the god of? What would their name be? What would they be like? Write a character description of your god and maybe include an illustration too.</p>	<p>For example:  6/12 (or 1/2) red  6/12 (or 1/2) blue  8/12 (or 4/6 or 2/3) red  4/12 (or 2/6 or 1/3) blue...  <b>LO: to solve problems involving fractions to calculate quantities</b></p>	<p>Extension: could you make a branching database and use it to identify different types of living things?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Include different colours, shapes and textures.</li> </ul>	<p>Read the story of the Wooden Horse of Troy. Could you make a model of the horse or draw a detailed, labelled picture showing how the people used it to trick their enemies.</p>
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
