LO To write a letter to an imaginary pen friend in another country Write a letter to an imaginary friend in North America telling them about your life in England. Remember to talk about where you live, what there is to do, what you enjoy doing. And don't forget to ask them questions about their life too, maybe how is their weather different to ours etc. Decide what country or state of America you would send your letter to.	Working out time durations Make a list of TV programmes you enjoy watching. Write down what time the programme starts and what time it finishes (or what time you start watching and what time you finish watching). Can you work out how long the programme is? Repeat for other programmes (you can use a TV guide for this if you want to) Ext - can you list the times in 12 and 24 hour? Can you record the durations in minutes and hours and minutes? LO to know the main stages of the human digestive system Write a postcard/letter/diary using to describe the journey of a piece of food all the way through the human body from mouth to toilet! eg Dear Family, I've just been cut up by sharp white boulders before being ground up by some different ones Write in the first person. Make sure you describe the journey from the perspective of the piece of food. Use Science words (ie incisor, large intestine etc) if you prefer, to name organs and processes or simply describe them as a piece of food.	Find out and write about a famous North American artist or painting. We will be looking at the paintings of Georgia O'Keeffe in class, so maybe choose someone else.
