
Stapleford Granary 'Small Grains'

This week our first visit to Stapleford Granary took place. Year 1 experienced 'Small Grains', a new pilot education programme developed by Stapleford Granary for pupils at Stapleford Primary School. I had the privilege of joining Year 1 for part of their morning and glimpse the experience the children were getting. I saw the class mesmerised and particularly enjoyed watching one of the children captivated by the violin playing which was part of the show. Pupils watched a shadow puppet show of Peter & the Wolf by Prokofiev and experienced the music. In addition, they heard Prokofiev's Symphony number 1 in D major and Prokofiev's Piano Sonata number 8 in B flat major as part of the performance.

Pupils returned to school full of their experiences, talking animatedly to other pupils and staff about what they had heard, seen and done! Mrs Bonham, class teacher reported it was a 'magical experience' for the class.

We are delighted to have this opportunity to work with Stapleford Granary and thankful to Kate Romano, Chief Executive and Artistic Director of Stapleford Granary who has made 'Small Grains' possible. Year 2 are looking forward to their trip next week.

Stapleford Coronation Celebration Day - Thursday 4th May
