

A little note...

As the weather is getting warmer every child should come into the Nursery with sun cream applied, a named sunhat and named water bottle. You are welcome to put sun cream in their bag for re-application during the day. Please ensure this has their name on too.

Drop off (for parents of children transitioning to Reception in September)

As many of the children will soon be transitioning into a Reception class, independence is extremely

important. Some parents may want to take this as an opportunity to drop off at the door to support the adjustment of doing this in the Reception class. However, if you are still coming in with your child, please make sure they are putting away their belongings independently. You could support this further at home by encouraging your child to dress themselves, put on their shoes and have a go at zipping up their jackets/doing their buttons.
