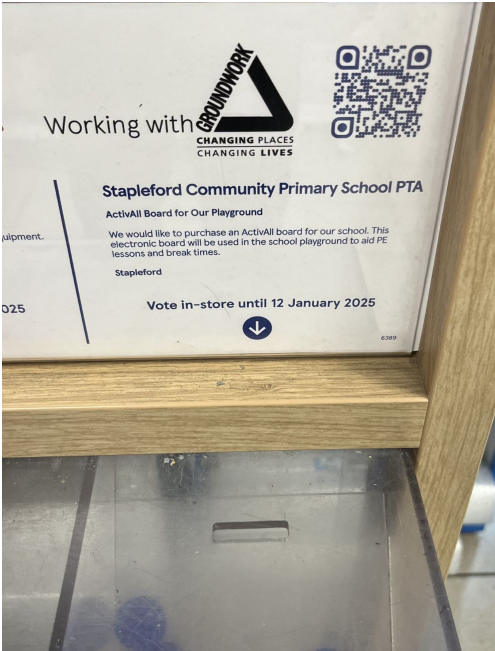

Rainbow Flag Award

In 2022, we were awarded the Rainbow Flag Award to recognise our commitment to creating an inclusive environment for pupils, staff and visitors.

The Rainbow Flag Award is a national quality assurance framework which focuses on positive LGBT+ inclusion and visibility. At Stapleford, we worked to include LGBT+ experts within our curriculum, learned about family dynamics and strove to create a safe space for our community. This year we are working to renew this award. As part of this, six pupils from UKS2 have volunteered to be 'Rainbow Ambassadors' to promote pupil voice in our school.

Just before half term, our new Rainbow Ambassadors spent time visiting different classes to read them stories. Two Year 5 pupils visited Year 2 to read 'The Marvellous Doctors for Magical Creatures'. They told the class: "We are the Rainbow Ambassadors and our job is to make sure everyone is equal."

POLICIES

It is important to highlight the importance of regular attendance at school. With the release of the DfE Statutory Guidance [“Working together to improve school attendance”](#) in August 2024 schools will be more rigorous in enforcing attendance rules to ensure every child benefits from a consistent, high-quality education.

What’s changing:

- **Closer monitoring:** Schools will now closely track attendance and work with local authorities to address persistent absenteeism.
- **Legal duties:** Parents are reminded of their legal obligation to ensure regular school attendance. While schools aim to support parents in this, fines and legal measures will be enforced more consistently if necessary.
- **Support for struggling students:** Schools are encouraged to identify and help children facing challenges that impact attendance, such as mental health issues or difficult home environments.

Please ensure all children registered at Stapleford Community Primary School attend regularly and punctually everyday, unless prevented from doing so by illness or medical appointment. It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. [NHS ‘Is my child too ill for school?’ guidance](#) has further information.

To ensure the safety of your child we need to know promptly if he/she is unable to attend school. We require you to telephone or email the office before 9am on each day of your child’s absence to provide your child’s name, class and reason for absence. For any pupil not present at the close of registration, and the reason is still unknown, a member of the team will aim to make contact by 9am. **Thank you for your support.**

“Attendance is the essential foundation to positive outcomes for all pupils and should therefore be seen as everyone’s responsibility.” (Working Together to Improve School Attendance - DFE Guidance, Sept 2022)
