

What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

The EYFS is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best when playing and exploring, when active learning and when being encouraged to create and think critically.

What do the children learn?

The EYFS Curriculum is separated into 7 areas of learning:

A typical day in Reception

- 8:45 Playground open. This is an opportunity to pass on any important information for the day.
- 8:50 The whistle is blown and children come into class. On the first day, parents/carers can come in to help their child find their peg, hang up their coat etc.
- **8.50-9.10** Self registration and fine motor activities.
- 9:15-9:45 Maths/circle time/introduction to the activities
- 9:45 10:30 Exploring time. This is the part of the day where children access activities and provision independently as well as planned activities with adults.

A typical day in Reception

- **10.30 10.45** Playtime
- 10.45 11.10 Phonics
- 11.10 12.00 Reading Practice Groups/Busy Learning
- **12.00** Lunchtime
- 1.15 1.30 Carpet time Topic Focus
- **1.30 2.55** Busy Learning
- 2.55 3.15 End of day Story, discussion about the day's learning and Star of the Day.
- 3.20 Parents wait in the front playground and each child is sent out to parents once the teachers have identified that someone is there to collect them.

How do we assess the children?

- There are two points where we complete statutory assessments of the children:
- In the first six weeks we complete the short Reception Baseline Assessment which focuses on Maths and Literacy skills.
- 2. At the end of the year we complete the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile which provides everyone with information about your child's attainment against the Early Learning Goals.

Partnership with Parents

You, as parents and carers are your child's first and most important educators. Evidence shows that when parents and school work closely together, the greatest impact on children's development and learning is seen. Here are some of the ways we try to work really closely with you:

- •Regular Communication parents' evenings each term and informal communication. The end of the day is best to catch us or you can make an appointment via the office.
- •Letters are sent home either via email or in the children's book bags.
- Curriculum Letters and Topic Webs are sent out each half term.

- WOW cards and Tapestry online learning journals.











What can you do to help?


- Talk, sing, read and count together!
- Promote your child's independence in getting dressed, washing their hands, doing up their coats and toileting.
- Play games together, practising sharing and taking turns.
- Talk positively about starting school there are lots of lovely books that you could read together.













Practical Matters!



- Uniform / P.E. Kit All clothing and items named please! Samples available at stay and play session. Uniform with logos can be purchased from Price Buckland.
- Drinks Please can the children bring in a named water bottle each day. In Reception, they also are provided with a glass of milk.
- Snacks In Reception and Key Stage 1 children are provided with a fruit/vegetable snack each day.
- Book bags please can your child bring their named, book bag into school each day.
- Wellies please could you send your child with a named pair of welly boots that stay in school as we endeavour to get outside in all weathers and we visit the moat each week.

- Lunch Reception and Key Stage 1 children can have a free school dinner which will be booked on the Innovate system. Please send them in with a named packed lunch if they are not having a school lunch.
- Collection Arrangements Please let us know if someone different is collecting your child.

Practical Matters - Free School Meals Explained!

All Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal (often referred to as UFSM).

However if you are in receipt of certain benefits you may be entitled to Free School Meals (FSM).


The difference is that if you are entitled to FSM there are other means of support that you can tap into. Once you are in receipt of benefits related Free School Meals your child's school will receive additional funding (Pupil Premium) to help and support throughout your child's education. The school will also receive extra support to deliver a fully inclusive and accessible education for all of our pupils. You can apply for Free School Meals at any time while your child is at Stapleford Community Primary School

Starting Arrangements

Wednesday 3rd September - Friday 5th September 2025	Home Visits: These will be by Class Teacher/Teaching Assistant by pre-booked appointment. Opportunities to book will be available on Tuesday 25th June and via the School Office. The class teacher will visit your home to meet you and your child. Visits last approximately 30 minutes.
Monday 8th September 2025	Morning only All Reception children in and collection at 12pm
Tuesday 9th September 2025	Morning only All Reception children in and collection at 12pm
Wednesday 10th September 2025	Morning, lunch and play only All Reception children in and collection at 1pm
Thursday 11th September 2025	All Reception children are in school full-time from this date. All arrangements are flexible through discussion between school and parents. Please note School Day = 0850 - 1520
